

In Numeracy, we focused on counting to 50 and then progressed to 100, working out the number before and after. We started our ABL on Friday, linking in with our topic 'Minibeasts'. P4 and P5 have got off to a great start and have adapted well to their new class and for some their new teacher. In Literacy we have been recapping punctuation, nouns and adjectives which we have implemented into our descriptive writing on the BFG characters. In Numeracy we have been looking at place value and times tables. P4 have been identifying 2 and 3 digits and P5 have been working with 3 and 4 digits. Our class novel is the 'BFG' and our topic this half term is 'The Rainforest'. **Miss Doyle P4/5**

In Literacy we've been writing recounts about our summer as well as exploring our class novel 'Street Child' through comprehension and drama. In Numeracy we have been revising some adding and subtracting, refreshing our brains on the basics. We started the new World Around Us topic of 'The Victorians' and have been researching key events in the timeline of the Victorian era. In ICT we started learning about coding, beginning with practical real life coding around obstacle courses. Setting our goals for the term has been an important part of our learning and has given us a target for the weeks ahead.
